Our Chairman's introduction

Welcome to our 2017 Newsletter giving you a flavour of what we have been up to in the last twelve months, and our plans for 2017. Last year was the 30th anniversary of formation of the Friendship Project, initially a pilot project launched by Charles Raeburn in Warwick, and in the words of our longstanding President, Michael Coker in 1986, "it is a great idea but it will not last"! He is so pleased we have proven him wrong. It was great to present to Leamington Rotary around the time of our actual anniversary, in May last year, as along with our President one of their late Rotary members, John Vallis, had been a founding trustee of the Friendship Project.

Most importantly a massive thank you on behalf of all the disadvantaged children we support to our volunteers, employees, fellow trustees, and our funders/supporters, without your help we could not help our Younger Friends.





We re-launched our active fund raising in 2016, having been supported partially by a legacy for the previous couple of years. We raised almost £27,000 in 2016, though this year really needs to be circa £45,000, as reserves are reducing. We are still looking for a Fund Raiser lead/trustee, and if you know anyone please get in touch with me. Primarily bid fund raising, but looking to establish a team, so as to promote and organise events linking with publicity and marketing for improving our profile, and at the same time help with recruitment.

At our AGM in 2016 it was agreed that we would move to CIO status, and this is underway, and should be completed during the year. We have engaged with Lodders solicitors, charity team to assist us with this transition. It will mean a new charity registration number, along with reissue of documentation to reflect this once it is all concluded.

In the last twelve months we celebrated our 30th Anniversary with a Summer Fayre, face painting, African drums, magician, fun activities, stalls and a BBQ with meat kindly donated by Aubrey Allen. See inside this newsletter for more photos of this event.

There are some exciting events planned for 2017, and do try and come along to as many of these as you are able. Any suggestions for the future are welcomed, and we have a few organisations willing to help us organise these too. We are also looking for ambassadors for the Friendship Project across Warwickshire, so any suggestions of people you think would be willing please let me know.

Her dedication and support for the Friendship Project is gratefully acknowledged.

We are just finalising the appointment of our new Honorary Secretary, Michelle Machin (pictured right), who will also be responsible for expenses payment and our PAYE shortly, in addition to her honorary secretary duties. Full details of when this will change from John Palmer will follow in due course. This allows John to continue as our honorary treasurer. He has recently had increasing work commitments both in London and overseas, which has meant he is not as available on a day to day basis, as previously.



We are also looking to appoint two further trustees who are in the pipeline, firstly **Gemma Allardyce**, whose day to day role is "Head of Customer and Brand" at The Co-operative Childcare,
The Midcounties Co-operative, and will be taking on trustee responsibility for marketing and PR. **Helena Harpham** as Older Friends representative, and **Esther Chamberlain**, who is a Strategy
Manager – Parenting and Family Support for Leicestershire County Council, and delivers our tailored safeguarding training, and has also been an older Friend, will take on trustee responsibility for training. It is hoped to conclude these appointments for the AGM, on 24th May 2017.



The other post that we really need to recruit for is **Bid Fund Raiser/Team leader/Trustee** – to lead our fund raising efforts, and take responsibility for bid fund raising. Training can be given. Following on from this Joan was then awarded the **Meritorious service award for children's "friend"** from the Rotary Club of Warwick presented its annual Meritorious Service Award to Joan Bolton at their meeting on Wednesday January 4th in recognition of her 20 years support to children in Warwickshire.

Rotarian Jackie Crampton introduced Joan to the club as one of our "unsung heroes". Joan is a local lady who joined the Friendship Project as an "Older Friend" when she retired from teaching in 1997. The Project matches an Older Friend to a Younger Friend — a child between 6 & 16 referred by Social Services, or identified by the education authority, as needing support. The child may have problems, or be in a difficult situation, and the older friend will provide care and interest for 2 or 3 hours every week with the aim of developing the child's personality and confidence.



Over 20 years Joan has spent time with many children, letting them talk, encouraging them to try something new, and making visits to the countryside, canals, and cycling. She is a quiet, modest lady who has spent a huge amount of time supporting children in the local Picture of President John Taylor with Joan Bolton

community, and responded to the citation by asking for more people to come forward and give time to support the work of the project.

President John Taylor expressed admiration for Joan's patient service and energy on behalf of the children of Warwick and presented her with a framed certificate and a cheque for £200 towards the work of the Friendship Project for Children.

Terry's Story

Fiona remarked that I had led quite an unusual life and would I like to tell everyone about it, and explain why I became a volunteer with the Friendship Project, so here goes.

Brief synopsis -. Twenty-two years in the Army, overcame my fear of heights and became an antenna rigger. Several overseas postings and two years in Northern Ireland on covert operations which involved climbing towers in the dead

of night and providing Comms for forthcoming SAS operations. Demob. Two-year contract with London Underground as a Trainer then I was out of work and on benefits for the next twelve months. Felt my experience in Northern Ireland was different enough to write the book, so I wrote the book, and got it published. Job offer in the Midlands training engineers to programme and maintain robots. Knew nothing about robots but when you've been unemployed for a year, DO you say NO! Several years in the field of robotics then decided to move on and spent seven years integrating homeless persons and ex-offenders back into society.

SO! Why did I become a volunteer with the Friendship Project? Because I read the findings of a government body that stated children who have an unhappy childhood are the ones most likely to suffer from mental health issues later in life, and I felt I had to do my bit.

The Friendship Project for Children is a local Warwickshire Charity and their aim is to improve the emotional and social well-being of disadvantaged children who are referred to us by Children's Services. I have now been a volunteer for many years, and currently take out two boys every week, and help them to experience some fun, alongside learning that there are boundaries in life to learn. Reports from their school say how much they have benefited and behaviour has improved.

Updates for Older friends...


Safeguarding - John Hancock (safeguarding officer)

Since the beginning of April 2015 fourteen reviews have taken place with families which the Project serves. Initially, OF's are contacted and the review process explained to them. Arrangements are then made to visit families to speak with parents and children (YF's).

The interviews are based on 10 questions asked of parents and 5 questions discussed with their children. For example, parents are asked whether the OF collects and returns the child at the correct time and, another, asks whether other children in the family are involved in the friendship activities. YF's are asked which activities they like best and whether there are things that they don't enjoy. There are opportunities for both parents and children to voice their disapproval about the Project's operations.

The interviews take, on average, about 15-20 minutes. In addition to answers relating to safeguarding, lots of positive comments have been received about the work of our volunteers. Following the meetings the answers are written up and forwarded to the appropriate Coordinator for information, action and filing. The Project Administrator is also informed about the calendar of reviews.

Finally, the OF's are contacted and given feedback from the review meetings. Overwhelmingly, this has been a very positive and rewarding part of the process for Volunteers, Operations Staff and Trustees.

SAFEGUARDING TRAINING SCHEDULE FOR NEW VOLUNTEER OLDER FRIENDS AND REFRESHER COURSES FOR EXISTING OLDER FRIENDS.

The purpose of each session will be to clarify and re-enforce the Safeguarding Procedures and Guidelines as issued to each Older Friend. Each session will include an introduction to Safeguarding and Protection for the Older Friend, together with an update on Child Protection and Safeguarding specifically relating to working with vulnerable children. Training will be provided on each date by a combined team of Trustees, existing Older Friends and external professional advisors. Latest training event took place on April 5th 2017. Details of the next training events later in the year will be published. Our best wishes to Esther, our trainer, who is expecting her first child at the end of April.


