This was at a time in my life when both of my children were independently living away from home, I was divorced, both my parents had passed away and I was made redundant, so I had more leisure time on my hands. I needed a new challenge and something that would occupy my time, particularly at weekends. I have always enjoyed my time with children particularly the simple things in life like taking the time to watch a snail carry its home to a new destination or watch ants in their busy lives. We forget to see things through children's eyes as we get older and I find it's an excuse to slow down and just have fun.

I was introduced to my Younger Friend ten years ago when she was 7 years old and we became firm friends immediately. Going to the park was her favourite activity at first followed by something to eat but then we started to venture further afield - taking my dog to country parks, swimming, the cinema, ice skating (not my greatest achievement!), museums, bowling, visited Birmingham on the train, National Trust properties, climbing walls, lambing at a farm and many more adventures. Horse riding became her favourite hobby and we have both made many friends at the Fathers Heart Youth Ranch, at Sheepy Magna supports disadvantaged Children with contact with horses and ponies.





I have had a wonderful fun time with my Younger Friend and gained as much from my involvement as my YF has matured into a confident young woman. The Friendship Project is no longer supporting her as she is now 17 years old but our friendship continues. I now have a new Younger Friend and look forward to many more adventures. The whole experience has been very rewarding and has had a major impact on boosting my own self confidence and given me the skill to order a meal at McDonalds!

Younger Friend Caitlin's Story: The Friendship Project has made a huge change to my life. It has helped me through good and bad times and I couldn't think of a better way to be supported. The thing I enjoyed most about being a Younger Friend is I entered new environments and gained new experiences. I loved every part of being with the Friendship project and I started gaining the confidence I didn't think I had. Spending time with Judy was amazing and I couldn't have asked for a better Older Friend. All I want to say is thank you to The Friendship Project.







#### Safeguarding

John Hancock our Safeguarding Officer reports that the Safeguarding Officer's role is to have oversight of all

the Project's procedures to ensure that safeguarding practise is robust.

The Safeguarding Committee met in November and are made up of:



Family Safeguarding Reviews are now conducted by Area Co-ordinators with assistance provided by the Safeguarding Officer.

Safeguarding training has been provided for Project members - 3 sessions per year. Until recently, sessions were led by a long-standing Older Friend, whose day job involves providing training provision for two neighbouring Local Authorities. She was assisted in the last training session by the Area Co-ordinator for Rugby. Future sessions will be led by the Area Co-ordinators for Rugby and Stratford until our regular trainer returns from maternity leave.

A valuable role played by the Safeguarding Officer has been day to day advice and guidance to Area Co-ordinators on a range of Safeguarding issues.

The purpose of each Safeguarding training session is to clarify and re-enforce the Safeguarding Procedures and Guidelines as issued to each volunteer. Each session will include an introduction to Safeguarding and Protection, together with an update on Child Protection and Safeguarding specifically relating to working with vulnerable children.
